



1. Registration

- Registration: Registration as apprentice or healer is conditional upon adhering to the “Wahdah” codes of ethics, conduct and practice.
- Apprentice Healers: Apprentice healers must be at least 18 years of age. Apprentice healers will be taught the “Wahdah” modality. Apprentice healers will be expected to adhere to the training standards as set by the “Wahdah” Healing & “Shifa Online”.
- Wahdah Healers: Wahdah Healers must be a minimum of 18 years of age. To be a registered “Wahdah” Healer, apprentice healers are expected to reach a level of understanding and development based on the principles required for “Wahdah” healer assessment as set by the “Wahdah” Healing & “Shifa Online”.
- Training: All healers are expected to continue their ongoing self-development. Healers will be required to keep their own self-development records. From time to time healers will be requested to work as mentors in a supporting role to Apprentice healers. Healers will follow the “Wahdah” Healing methods.
- Certificates: Healers must make available in their place of work their appropriate certificates and qualifications.
- Code of Ethics, Conduct and Practice: Access to copies of our Codes of Ethics, Conduct and Practice must be made available to patients or interested parties upon request.
- Titles: Healers must not use titles or work descriptions to give the impression of medical or other qualifications, unless they possess those titles.

2. Healing Definitions

- “Wahdah” In Person Healing is a healing that is done in the presence of the recipient who may be seated or lying in a comfortable position. The healer’s hands should be held off the recipient body. Healer should never lay their hands on the recipient.
- “Wahdah” Distant Healing is healing which is given when the healer is not in the presence of the recipient. The healer performs the methods of “Wahdah” distant healing to promote healing, and the well being of the recipient.



3. General Standard for Healers

The Healing Environment

- **Healing Place:** Healing can take place anywhere and healers should do their best to ensure the working surroundings are suitable and encouraging to a good environment. The healing place should also meet with the local authority regulations.
- **Healer verification:** Healers should at all times carry current evidence of registration and qualifications. Upon request they should show such evidence.

Relationship with patients

- **Consent:** Healers only give healing with the patient’s consent.
- **Curing:** Healers must not claim any capability to be able to cure.
- **Diagnosis:** Healers must not make any diagnosis of an illness.
- **Objective:** Healers must work with honesty, neutrality and respect for all. All professional relationships and interactions should be ethical and caring.
- **Professional behavior:** Healers must not do anything that would dishonor the “Wahdah” or “Shifa Online”. Healers must behave in a professional manner with caution, tact and courtesy at all times.
- **Beliefs:** Healers should not express their personal beliefs and views. Healers must respect all the religious, spiritual and personal views of others.
- **Relationship:** Healers must take responsibility for the relationship they have with their patients. Healers must ensure that the trust placed in them is upheld.



- “Wahdah” In Person Healing: Healers must not touch the patient and work with their hands off the patient.
- Grounding: Healers should make sure that after the healing patients are well grounded and in a state of full consciousness before leaving.
- Confidentiality: Healers must not disclose any personal information if given by patient during healing without the individual’s prior, signed, written agreement, unless required doing so by law.
- Non Judgmental: Healers shall be without judgment concerning – age, class and background, color, creed, disability, gender, marital status, race, or sexual orientation, and the way that the patients choose to live their lives and their choice of treatments.
- Healer’s Limits: Healers must be aware of their own limits physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.
- Behavior: Healers’ behavior must not include any action that can be construed as indecent assault or harassment.
- Clothing of Patient: Healers must not request the removal of clothing.



Administration

- **Patient’s Records:** Healers should maintain a patient record for every patient. Details should be recorded for each healing session on the patient’s session record. Healers should record their visits to patient’s homes. The records must be available to “Wahdah” upon request.
- **Payment:** All healing under the name of the “Wahdah” or “Shifa Online” must be given free of charge.
- **Local Authority Regulations:** Healers who are using their home as a place to give healing are advised to ensure that they are complying with local government regulations (If Any).
- **Complaints:** Healers are advised to respond to criticism and complaints promptly.

Advertising

- **Dignified Tone:** If Healers advertise, the content should be dignified in tone and shall not claim a cure, or mention any particular disease.
- **Testimonials:** Healers always try to collect testimonials with the written permission of the patient. They are required by the “Wahdah”.
- **Initials:** Healers may use the initials RWH Registered “Wahdah” Healer or RWA Registered “Wahdah” Apprentice after their names.
- **Visiting Cards:** Healers can use visiting cards bearing the “Wahdah” logo and name.
- **“Wahdah” Logo:** The “Wahdah” logo can only be used to advertise events that are being officially organized on behalf of the “Wahdah” or “Shifa Online”.
